



Mandatory and Discretionary Employment Disqualifiers

Per State Law you CANNOT be a Deputy Sheriff in Hood River County, Oregon if:

- 1. You cannot obtain valid driving privileges in Oregon.
- 2. You are not at least 21 years of age as of the close date of the recruitment for which you apply.
- 3. You will not be a U.S. citizen within 18 months of being hired.
- 4. You have been convicted of a Domestic Violence Assault.
- 5. You have been convicted of a felony.
- 6. You have been convicted of any crime involving controlled substances.
- 7. You do not have a High School Diploma or GED.
- 8. The State of Oregon will not provide the required certification if you have been convicted of any of the crimes listed in the <u>Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR), Section 259-008-0300</u>

 Denial/Revocation.

Per Hood River County Selection Criteria, you are NOT LIKELY to be hired as a Hood River County Deputy Sheriff if:

- 1. Your traffic record, police contacts and/or accident reports show a continuing and/or recent pattern of poor decision making.
- 2. Your personal life shows a history of poor judgment.
- 3. You have a history of involvement in criminal activity.
- 4. Your work history shows a pattern of unexcused absences, discipline and/or discharge.
- 5. Have used dangerous drugs or narcotics, other than marijuana, within the last five (5) years or more than two (2) time(s) in a lifetime.
- 6. You have been convicted of driving under the influence of intoxicants (D.U.I.I.) within the past 5 years (a diversion or similar action is considered the same as a conviction). You have been convicted of Reckless Driving, Attempting to Elude, Hit and Run (Failure to perform the duties of a driver...), or Driving while Suspended / Revoked within the last five (5) years.
- 7. You have a Dishonorable Discharge from the armed services
